I. _____ *prayerful*

II. _____ *loving*

"Most important of all, continue to show deep (*ektenēs*) love (*agapē*) for each other, for love covers a multitude of sins." 1 Peter 4:8

ektenēs: "strong, stretched, strained"

agapē: "Love from God, unfailing love"

"Here we are, redeemed, indwelt, heaven bound, but we still sin against each other. Peter calls us here to not sweat the 'small stuff.' Note, however, that he recognizes that the small stuff is still sin. The text doesn't say, 'Love covers a multitude of unwise, selfish, arrogant, shameful decisions' ... When we are wronged our calling is to practice a careful moral calculus. Is this offense one I should let go of? Is it among the multitude that love covers? Or is this offense grievous enough that love means confronting in grace my brother? Sadly what we usually do is think we are practicing the former while actually holding

grudges and putting miracle-grow on roots of bitterness. Peace in the church calls us to under-accuse, over-repent and over-forgive. Let us not be afraid to call sin sin, but let us not be slow to forgive it and to look past it."

III. _____ *generous*

"Cheerfully share your home with those who need a meal or a place to stay. God has given gifts to each of you from his great variety of spiritual gifts. Manage them well so that God's generosity can flow through you." 1 Peter 4:9-10
